

1. **Silver Donkey, The (Sonya Hartnett) \$24.95 \$19.95**

(RRP) (SCHOOL)
One bright spring morning in the woods of France, a soldier, blinded by the war, is found by a little girl named Coco, and her older sister Marcelle. In return for their kindness, the soldier tells the sisters marvellous tales, each story connected to the keepsake he carries in his pocket: a perfect, tiny silver donkey.

2. **Soraya the Storyteller (Rosanne Hawke) \$14.95 \$11.95**

Soraya is an 11-year-old asylum seeker from Afghanistan living under a temporary protection visa as she and her family begin a new life in South Australia where she attends school for the first time. Soraya writes a story for a competition but it is not submitted as the relief teacher doesn't think an ESL student would write well enough to win. An author, however, includes it in a collection of children's refugee stories.

3. **A Horse Called Elvis (John Heffernan) \$14.95 \$11.95**

When an orphaned foal becomes part of Matt's family, the trouble really begins. This is a story of one boy's determination, a family's struggle to stay together, and the foal that changes all their lives. This gritty tale portrays the tough face of rural poverty, while maintaining a sense of tenderness and hope.

4. **Tiff and the Trout (David Metzenthen) \$16.95 \$13.55**

Tiff's dad taught her to love the mountains, the snow, the streams and the trout. Her mum dreams of life by the beach. If Mum makes the move to Queensland, what will happen to Tiff and her brother, Nathan?

5. **The Boy, the Bear, the Baron, the Bard (Gregory Rogers) \$27.95 \$22.35**

A boy bursts through the curtains of a deserted theatre and onto the world's most famous stage. Join him in this Midsummer Magic and a chase through the streets of Shakespeare's London. A pacy story about a curious boy, a grumpy bard, a captive bear and a baron whose head is bound for the chopping block. A text-less comic style tale of adventure and friendship in picture book format.

6. **Billy Mack's War (James Roy) \$16.95 \$13.55**

This exceptional book is the prequel to Captain Mack and takes us back to 1945, to the time when the world was trying to recover from five years of war and wondering if things and families would ever be the same again. When Captain Mack is released from prison camp no one is sure what to expect least of all his son Billy.



7. Dougal the Garbage Dump Bear (Matt Dray)

Based on a true story, with photos taken by someone who was there, Dougal the Garbage Dump Bear is a heart-warming and hilarious picture book for all the family. One rainy afternoon, Dougal is left outside and ends up in the garbage bin. How much can a teddy bear? But even though he's down, Dougal is not out. He finds a new life and learns that sometimes bad luck can be your best friend.

8. Mr Noah and the Cats (Vashti Farrer and Neil Curtis)

All Mr Noah asked for was a bit of peace and quiet, but then God told him to build an ark and life suddenly became very noisy. Among all the animal noises there was one he hadn't heard before – from an animal he didn't even know existed. That is until the lion sneezed! This is a StartUps novel.






25. The Running Man (Michael Gerald Bauer)

Fourteen-year-old Joseph, a talented artist, is drawing a portrait of his silent, brooding neighbour, Tom Leighton. To draw him accurately, Joseph must see beyond the rumours and gossip to the man himself, the Vietnam War veteran who passes his days tending his silkworms and keeping his dark secrets. Joseph's own horror of the running man, the dishevelled figure of his nightmares, endlessly repeating a pattern, recedes with his growing understanding of the difficult relationships in his family.

Some battles are imposed on us, some fought within. When Vinnie Santiani's sister is killed, he runs from the world to the isolation of the bush, driven by fear and loneliness. 

31. Beegu (Alexis Deacon)

Beegu is not supposed to be on Earth. She is lost. She thinks she hears her mother call, but from far, far away. She is a friendly little creature, but the Earth People don't seem very welcoming at all. So far, though, she has only met the BIG ones. The little ones are a different matter. This is a lovely story about what it means to be from somewhere else.

32. Best-Loved Stories from Hans Christian Andersen, The (Andrew Matthews)


