Lottie loves collecting facts about bugs, but she wishes her dad would stop filling their lonely house with junk. She doesn't know what to do about it. Jack wants to be a cricket star, but first he has to get to school and look after his little sister. Especially if he wants to go on the class trip and see the ocean for the first time. 13. Hello Lighthouse (Sophie Blackall) \$15.99 (RRP) \$12.79 (School)

On the highest rock of a tiny island at the edge of the world stands a lighthouse. From dusk to dawn, the lighthouse beams, sending its light out to sea, guiding the ships on their way. As the seasons pass and the waves rise and fall, outside, the wind blows; inside, the lighthouse keeper writes, and the rhythms of his life unfold. But change is on the horizon... **Change-Time-Inventions-Family Unit**

14. Nop (Caroline Magerl) \$26.99 (RRP) \$21.59 (School)

A heart-warming picture book about two unlikely loners who forge a forever friendship. Nop is a scruffy kind of bear. 17. Good Son: A Story from the First World War, The (Jules Ober and Pierre-Jacques Ober) \$34.99 (RRP) \$27.99 (School)

It is Christmastime, 1914, and World War I rages. A young French soldier named Pierre had quietly left his regiment to visit his family for two days, and when he returned, he was imprisoned. Now he faces execution for desertion, and as he waits in isolation, he meditates on big questions: the nature of patriotism, the horrors of war, the joys of friendship, the love of family, and how even in times of danger, there is a whole world inside every one of us. And how sometimes that world is the only refuge. Its publication coinciding with the centennial of the signing of the Treaty of Versailles, this moving and sparely narrated story, based on true events, is re-enacted in fascinating miniature scenes that convey the emotional complexity of the tale. 19. Illustrated Encyclopedia of Ugly Animals, The (Sami Bayly) \$32.99 (RRP) \$26.39 (School) It's time for ugly animals to shine! With more than sixty ugly animals to explore, this compendium of the unusual celebrates the beauty in 'ugliness'. Children and adults alike will pore over the breathtaking scientific illustrations of unusual animals, debating their relative ugliness and merits, learning about science and nature along the way. 20. Searching for Cicadas (Lesley Gibbes and Judy Watson) \$26.99 (RRP) \$21.59 (School)

This lovely story about a child and their grandfather searching for cicadas is part of the award-winning narrative nonfiction Nature Storybooks series. In the summertime, Grandpa and I go cicada-watching. We put our camping gear into my wagon and walk down to the local reserve. 22. Wilam: A Birrarung Story (Joy Murphy and Lisa Kennedy) \$24.99 (RRP) **\$19.99** (School) In this stunning picture book beautifully given form by Indigenous artist Lisa Kennedy, respected Elder Aunty Joy Murphy and Yarra Riverkeeper Andrew Kelly tell the story of one day in the life of the vital, flourishing Birrarung (Yarra river) from its source to its mouth; from its pre-history to the present day. An ode to Australian rivers, the flora and fauna that live on them, and the function they perform as a part of modern day life. Wilam brings Aboriginal life, culture and language right in to the heart of the city. **Aboriginal Studies-Rivers-Yarra River-Australian Animals-Australian Flora**


23. Young Dark Emu: A Truer History (Bruce Pascoe) \$24.99 (RRP) \$19.99 (School)

Using the accounts of early European explorers, colonists and farmers, Bruce Pascoe compellingly argues for a reconsideration of the hunter-gatherer label for pre-colonial Aboriginal Australians. He allows the reader to see Australia as it was before Europeans arrived – a land of cultivated farming areas, productive fisheries, permanent homes, and an understanding of the environment and its natural resources that supported thriving villages across the continent. 25. Boy Who Steals Houses, The (CG Drew) \$16.99 (RRP) \$13.59 (School)

Sam is only fifteen but he and his autistic older brother, Avery, have been abandoned by every relative houses when their owners are away, until one day he's caught out when a family returns home. To his amazement this large, chaotic family takes him under their wing - each teenager assuming Sam is a friend of another sibling. Sam finds himself inextricably caught up in their life, and falling for the beautiful Moxie. But Sam has a secret, and his past is about to catch up with him. **Ages 14+ Homelessness-Abandonment-Autism-Friendship-Family Unit-Death/ Bereavement**

26. How It Feels to Float (Helena Fox) \$17.99 (RRP) \$14.39 (School)

Biz knows how to float. She has her people, posse, her mum and the twins. She has Grace. And she has her dad, who tells her about the little kid she was, and who shouldn't be here but is. So Biz doesn't tell anyone anything. Not about her dark, runaway thoughts, not about kissing Grace or noticing Jasper, the new boy. And she doesn't tell anyone about her dad. Because her dad died when she was seven. And Biz knows how to float, right there on the surface - normal okay regular fine. **Ages 15+ Mental Health-Depression-Suicide-Death/Bereavement-Grief-Family Unit-Friendship**

27. Ghost Bird (Lisa Fuller) \$19.95 (RRP) \$15.99 (School)

Stacey and Laney are twins - mirror images of each other - and yet they're as different as the sun and moon. Stacey works hard at school, determined to get out of their small town. Laney skips school and sneaks out of the house to meet her boyfriend. But when Laney disappears one night, Stacey can't believe she's just run off without telling her. As the days pass and Laney doesn't return, Stacey starts dreaming of her twin. The dreams are dark and terrifying, difficult to understand and hard to shake, but at least they tell Stacey one key thing - Laney is alive. Stacey is the only one who can find her sister. Will she find her in time? **Ages 15+ Mystery-Twins-Family Unit-Rural-Friendship-School**

28. When The Ground is Hard (Malla Nunn) \$19.99 (RRP) \$15.99 (School)

But when dark secrets threaten their reluctant partnership and put everything at stake, Keralie and Varin must use all their daring to stay alive and untangle the mysteries behind the nation's four dead queens. **Ages 14+ Fantasy-Adventure-Mystery**

Sixteen-year-old Nate McKee is doing his best to be invisible. 31. Louie and Snippy Save the Sea (Grant Cowan and Collette Dinigan) \$24.99 (RRP) **\$19.99** (School)

Louie and Snippy: Under the Sea is a story of a little boy whose love of the ocean takes him, and the reader, on an incredible underwater journey. Louie and his trusty companion, Snippy the dog, dive into the ocean and are surrounded by brilliant coral reefs. But they soon discover that human rubbish - bottles, plastic straws and plastic bags - have trapped fish and other creatures. What will Louie be inspired to do?

32. Paperboy (Bethany MacDonald and Danny Parker) \$24.99 (RRP) \$19.99 (School)

Paperboy is a journey through the salient moments of a young boy's life the fears, the trials, the tragedies and the small triumphs with each moment contemplated in terms of paper. Tissue paper that Paperboy is written by Danny Parker, whose poetic prose for young readers has won him prestigious awards. Bethany Macdonald's robust expressionist collages both embody and illustrate the themes of this poignant story.

So when the government builds a wall through the city, guarded by soldiers, tanks and ferocious dogs, he's trapped. Everyone says he might never see his family again. But Peter has a courageous plan . . . Set in Cold War Germany, A Great Escape is a story of true-life heroism and the unbreakable bonds of family. **Ages 10+ War Stories-Cold War-Family Unit-Berlin Wall-History**

39. Detention (Tristan Bancks) \$16.95 (RRP) \$13.59 (School)


