Tom's books have been translated into thirty-two languages and his most recent is called There's A Dragon in Your Book.




Illustrator Bio

Tom and Shane have worked together on a number of other books with similar designs/styles:

- Christmasaurus
- The Christmasaurus and the Winter Witch
- The Creakers.

Have a look at these titles and look at the layout. How are they the same or different to The Danger Gang?

After the crazy storm, Franky and his friends start to 'change'.

- Eric turned into shark, because he wanted to be a better swimmer.
- Mollie turned invisible, because she was so embarrassed she just wanted to disappear.
- Ronnie turned into a baby when he started crying
- Suzy turned into a giant pumpkin when her parents were ignoring her.

Have you even been in a situation where you would like to be able to turn into something else?

Write 'a day in the life' story about what it would be like to change or turn into something else. Why did you choose to change in that particular way?

Letter Writing

This story is told using the letters that Franky writes to his best friend Dani.

We read Franky's letters, but we never read Dani's replies. Choose one of Franky's letters and write a reply from Dani to Franky.

Imitate Franky's style and use pictures in your letter, and large letters to emphasize different words.

Invention

Franky's mum is a scientist, and an inventor.

She has a lab in their new house full of inventions, such as:

- Pancake-O-Matic Makes pancakes automtically
- Luggage-Shrink-O-Zap Shrinks your suitcases, so that you can take as much luggage as you like on holidays.
- Kid-Shutter-Upper Keeps children quiet for 5 minutes

Ask students to think of their own invention. It can be as whacky and improbable

as they like, but they have to be able to create a design for it, explain what it does and how it would work.

As part of the design plan, think of possible pitfalls (ie the Auto-Nappy-Changer that doesn't know the difference between Franky and his baby brother Max!) and factor this into their design.

Students present their design to the class.
