When Nicola was 5 years old her parents banned Saturday morning television, and she has been drawing ever since.


Born in Swaziland, Nicola grew up in Singapore and has lived in Papua New Guinea, Kenya, Edinburgh, London and Cambridge.


She now lives in Los Angeles with her husband, Sjoerd, and their invisible dog, Chewbacca.



Discussion Questions

Show the cover of Bad Cat to your students, reading the name of the book out loud, and ask the following:

- Identify the author, and the illustrator (in this case it's the same person)
- What does an author do?
- What does an illustrator do?
- What can you see on the front cover?
- Based on the title of the book, what do you think the book will be about?
- What can we tell by the expression on the cats face?

Now turn the cover over and show the back of the book to your students, reading out loud what the book will be about.

Does it give you more clues as to what the book is about?

Responding to texts

Have a selection of other books of other books written by Nicola O'Byrne. Are there some that the students like more than others? Why?

Also have some books by other authors with the same theme (see next page). After reading a selection, talk about how the stories are the same and different?

Pets:

Who has a pet at home? Has your pet ever been as naughty as Fluffykins? What naughty things has your pet done?

Activity:

Draw a picture of your pet being naughty or being good. Example:

A dog digging up the garden (naughty) OR

A cat snuggling on your lap (good)


If you don't have a pet, what kind of pet would you like? What naughty things could that pet get up to?

Or what nice things would it do?


Draw that pet.







